

2015 End of Year Report

San Juan Island Park and Recreation District (locally known as Island Rec) established in 1984 as a junior taxing district for San Juan Island is governed by an elected board of five commissioners. Serving during 2015 were Commissioners Bill Cumming (chair), Jacquelyn Reiff, Scott Zehner, Tracy Roberson and Adam Eltinge.

It is the purpose of San Juan Island Park and Recreation District to enhance the quality of life on San Juan Island by:

- Offering the widest variety of leisure and recreational activities to all island residents
- Acquiring, developing, maintaining, preserving and protecting recreational resources
- Ensuring that recreational activities and facilities are accessible and affordable to all residents.

Administration

2015 was the sixth year of the 17 cent levy passed in November of 2009 and the sixth year of the inter-local agreement with the school district where as Island Rec funds school sports with seven cents of this levy. The operating expenses totaled \$780,328 with 31% allocated for school sports.

Island Rec went to the voters in April asking for approval of a six-year 36.5 cent levy. 18.5 cents would be used for continuation of Island Rec's programs, parks and services, 12 cents would ensure continuation of the school sports program and 8 cents would be used for the maintenance and operations of the new community park on Carter Ave. 68% of voters approved this request.

The budget specific to Island Rec totaled \$537,115. Tax dollars paid 36% of Island Rec's budget, which was a decrease from 63% in 2014. The Lafarge Reserve Fund was closed and that money was transferred to the operating budget accounting for 25% of the budget. Program fees paid 31% of all budget expenses and revenue generated by other fees, grants and sponsorships accounts for 8%.

FANS, Families and Neighbors Support Island Rec, a 501c3 created in 2012 for the purpose of expanding Island Rec's level of service and keeping it thriving, contributed \$14,700. In 2014 FANS contribution was \$18,499. FANS continued to provide funds for Movies in the Park, Music on the Lawn, Children's Festival, program scholarships, doggie waste bags and the 8.8k Race. Additionally FANS provided 64 swim lessons and prizes for events, staff and volunteer recognition awards.

In 2014 San Juan County Assessor notified Island Rec of an error made when setting Island Rec's tax rate collection. The result of this error required Island Rec to pay back \$377,000 over three years. In 2015 the first payment of \$125,731 was made.

Earthbox Inn, Harbor Rentals, Kings Market, Islanders Bank, Islanders Insurance, Island Petroleum Services, Roche Harbor Resort, San Juan Suites, Vinny's Ristorante, Rock Island, Soroptimists and Xtreme Fitness continue as key sponsors of Island Rec events.

Island Rec's Director Sally Thomsen resigned after 15 years of service. In May, Maddie Ovenell replaced Sally as the Interim Director and officially accepted the Director position in September. Lowell Jons, the Youth and Family Recreation Specialist completed his first year. Morgan Johnston, the Sports Recreation Specialist completed her third year. Jordan Reinhart completed his first year as the School's Our Program Coordinator. Julie Daquelente completed her first year as the Administrative Assistant. Dale Downs worked in his 7th year as the Park Maintenance/Custodian. Island Rec employed 21 seasonal and part-time employees working Camp Eagle Rock, Sailing Classes, STAR, Open Gym, Open Fair Building and other specialty programs. 115 volunteers contributed more than 1800 hours providing park and recreation programs and services for San Juan Islanders.

Parks, Trails and Open Space

Island Rec operates three parks: The Family Park and Skate Park at the Fairgrounds, Eddie & Friends Dog Park and Lafarge (Gravel Pit) Open space. Expenses for all parks and the Trails Committee account for 10% of Island Rec's budget with 15% of tax dollars collected financing them. Regular trash pick up and general maintenance occurs for these parks three times per week during spring, summer and fall, and reduced to two times per week in the winter. Vandalism at the skate park required extra maintenance. A spring toy was replaced at the Family Park. In July, the pavilion roof of the Family Park was replaced using lodging tax (LTAC).

Programs

The cornerstone of Island Rec is its year-round broad recreation programming. It operates in three distinct seasons, offering special events and on-going activities for people of all ages. The majority of Island Rec resources are dedicated to recreation programs.

Highlights of the 2015 recreation program were:

- The STAR program participation increased from an average of 17 kids per day to 26.
- Camp Eagle Rock had very strong enrollment this summer. We had 70 kids per week with a waitlist for each week of camp.
- A new family event, Family Splash was well received with 62 participants.
- TREC program participation increased from 176 students to 273 students.
- Teen Adventure Camps all filled to capacity during the summer and each camp had a waiting list.

Partnerships are vital to Island Rec's success and to serving the San Juan Island community effectively. Partnerships and cooperative programming avoids duplication of services and utilizes existing resources to deliver a better service. Island Rec continued its ongoing partnerships with:
