

2016 End of Year Report

San Juan Island Park and Recreation District (locally known as Island Rec) established in 1984 as a junior taxing district for San Juan Island is governed by an elected board of five commissioners. Serving during 2016 were Commissioners Scott Zehner (chair), Jacquelyn Reiff, Bill Cumming, Adam Eltinge and Tracy Roberson, who vacated the position in October.

It is the purpose of San Juan Island Park and Recreation District to enhance the quality of life on San Juan Island by:

- Offering the widest variety of leisure and recreational activities to all island residents
- Acquiring, developing, maintaining, preserving and protecting recreational resources
- Ensuring that recreational activities and facilities are accessible and affordable to all residents.

Administration

2016 was the first year of the 38.5 cent levy passed in April of 2015 and the first year of a new inter-local agreement with the school district. Island Rec utilizes 18.5 cents of this levy, school sports is funded with 12 cents of this levy and eight cents of this levy is used for the maintenance and operations of John O. Linde Community Park, which the school district owns. The operating expenses totaled \$1,097,132 with 24% allocated for school sports and 17% allocated for maintenance and operations of Linde Park.

The budget specific to Island Rec totaled \$709,554. Tax dollars paid 59% of Island Rec's budget. Program fees paid 28% of all budget expenses and revenue generated by other fees, grants and sponsorships accounts for 13%.

FANS, Families and Neighbors Support Island Rec, a 501c3 created in 2012 for the purpose of expanding Island Rec's level of service and keeping it thriving, contributed \$13,500 and a grant from the Honeywell Charitable Foundation for the playground at John O. Linde Community for \$6012.00. The total contribution from FANS was \$19,512. FANS continued to provide funds for Movies in the Park, Music on the Lawn, Children's Festival, program scholarships, doggie waste bags and the 8.8k Race. New this year, FANS offered concessions at all the Music on the Lawn nights. Additionally, FANS provided 135 swim lessons and prizes for events, staff and volunteer recognition awards.

In 2014 San Juan County Assessor notified Island Rec of an error made when setting Island Rec's tax rate collection. The result of this error required Island Rec to pay back \$377,000 over three years. In 2016, the second payment of \$125,731 was made.

Harbor Rentals, Kings Market, Islanders Bank, Islanders Insurance, Island Petroleum Services, Roche Harbor Resort, Vinny's Ristorante, Soroptimists, and Xtreme Fitness continue as key sponsors of Island Rec events.

Island Rec's Director Maddie Ovenell completed her first year. Lowell Jons, the Youth and Family Recreation Specialist completed his second year. Morgan Johnston, the Sports Recreation Specialist completed her fourth year. After two years of service Jordan Reinhart resigned and Christy Haase replaced him in December as the School's Out Program Coordinator. Julie Daquelente resigned and Heidi White returned in April as the Administrative Assistant. Brian Cool started in January in a newly created position for Island Rec as the Park Maintenance Superintendent. His employment end in October and Tracy Roberson replaced him in the position. Island Rec employed 30 seasonal and part-time employees working Camp Eagle Rock, Sailing Classes, STAR, Open Gym, Open Fair Building and other specialty programs.

Parks, Trails and Open Space

Island Rec operates five parks: The Family Park and Skate Park at the Fairgrounds, Eddie & Friends Dog Park, Lafarge (Gravel Pit) Open space and John O. Linde Community Park as of January 1, 2016.

Expenses for all parks (excluding John O. Linde Community Park) and the Trails Committee account for 8% of Island Rec's budget with 13% of tax dollars collected financing them. Regular trash pick up and general maintenance occurs for these parks daily during spring, summer and fall, and adjusted in the winter based on usage.

The operations and maintenance of John O. Linde Community Park is a multi-phase process. In 2016, Island Rec assumed responsibility for the maintenance building, soccer field and softball field in addition to the main field house. Island Rec was responsible for installation of the playground at the field, which took place October 1, 2016 with the help of over 40 community volunteers. We received additional funding for the playground from the Town of Friday Harbor, San Juan County and the Honeywell Charitable Fund of The Community Foundation of the Rappahannock River Region.

Programs

The cornerstone of Island Rec is its year-round broad recreation programming. It operates in three distinct seasons, offering special events and on-going activities for people of all ages. The majority of Island Rec resources are dedicated to recreation programs.

Highlights of the 2016 recreation program were:

- The STAR program participation stayed steady with an average of 26 participants daily.
- Camp Eagle Rock enrollment was increased to 80 campers each week. Additionally we also added two additional weeks of camp once CER ended. These two weeks had a max enrollment of 40 campers each week and both weeks filled.
- Two new pre-school age programs occurred during the summer, Art Explorers and Playtime Circus.
- TREC program participation increased from 315 students to 408 students.

- A new event, Hill of Thrills Soapbox Race was added to our annual calendar in May. This family event had just over 20 participants build a car and run the course located on Park Street.
- This year we developed a new partnership with Spring Street School to offer additional summer programs for youth. In total, six new programs were added during the summer.
- Music on the Lawn, which started in 2000, increased to one more day this summer. We now offer a total of six nights of music in July and August as this popular summer event. The Resolution Run, a new community running event which takes place on January 1, was added in 2016.
- A new Mother Son Scavenger Hunt was added in the spring. After hosting an on-line survey, the community chose this as an annual event.

Partnerships are vital to Island Rec's success and to serving the San Juan Island community effectively. Partnerships and cooperative programming avoids duplication of services and utilizes existing resources to deliver a better service. Island Rec continued its ongoing partnerships with:
